This workshop will focus on the administration and coding of the Rorschach, using the R-PAS approach. The workshop will consist of a series of Rorschach responses that have tricky administration and/or coding issues. Practical guidelines will be provided, based on the R-PAS manual. Group discussions will also be encouraged.

This workshop is also helpful for licensed psychologists who are currently using the Rorschach as part of their assessments; practical information will also be provided to help improve psychologists' administration skills. Participants will learn that Rorschach is challenging and that accurate administration and coding are essential to obtaining valid assessment results.

Rorschach is a very tricky test to use, and being able to administer and code the test correctly is essential to getting a valid protocol.


